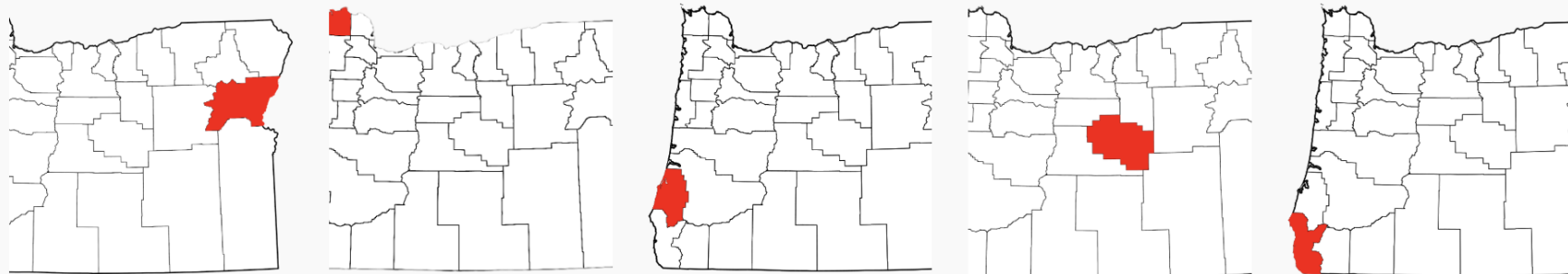


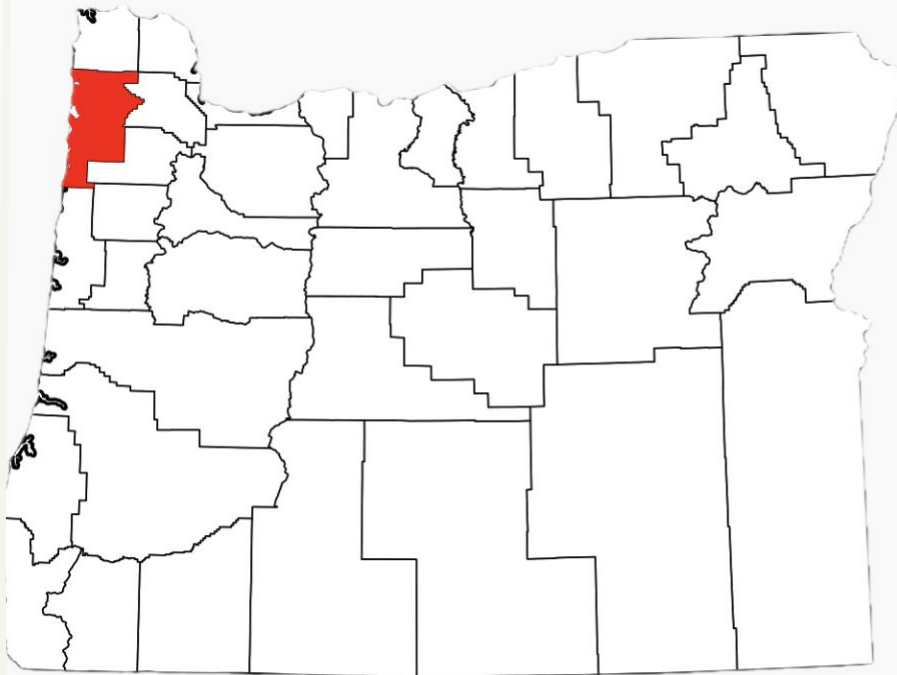
End-of-Life (EOL) Friendly Criteria for Communities:

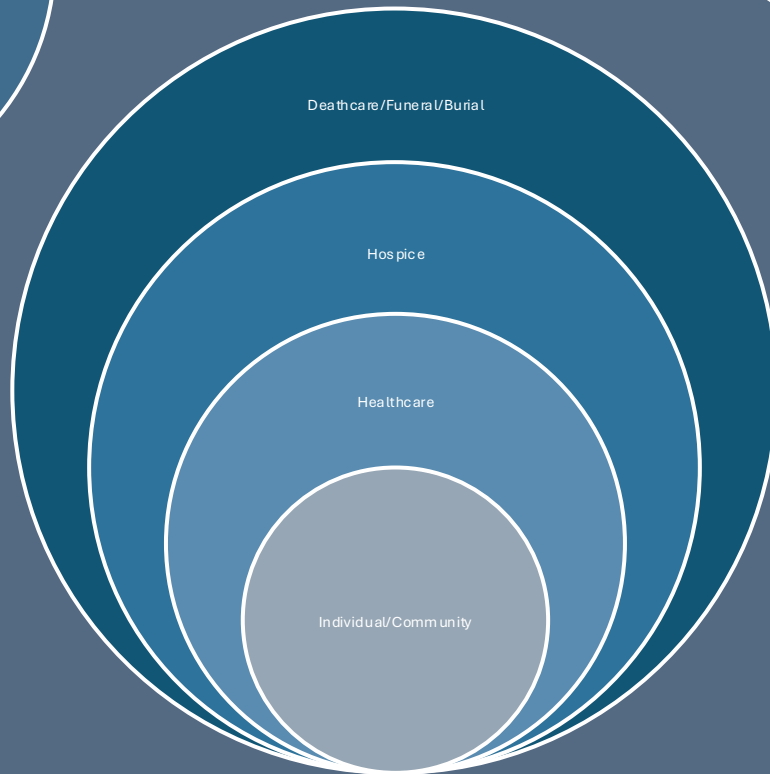
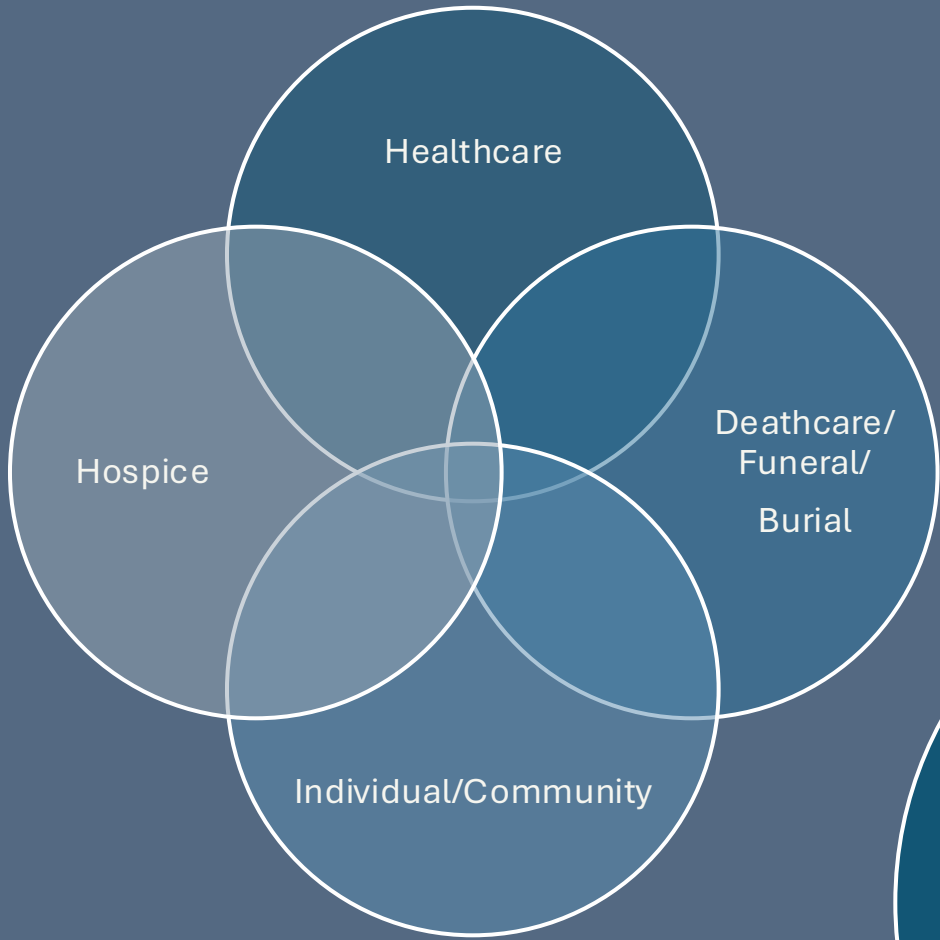

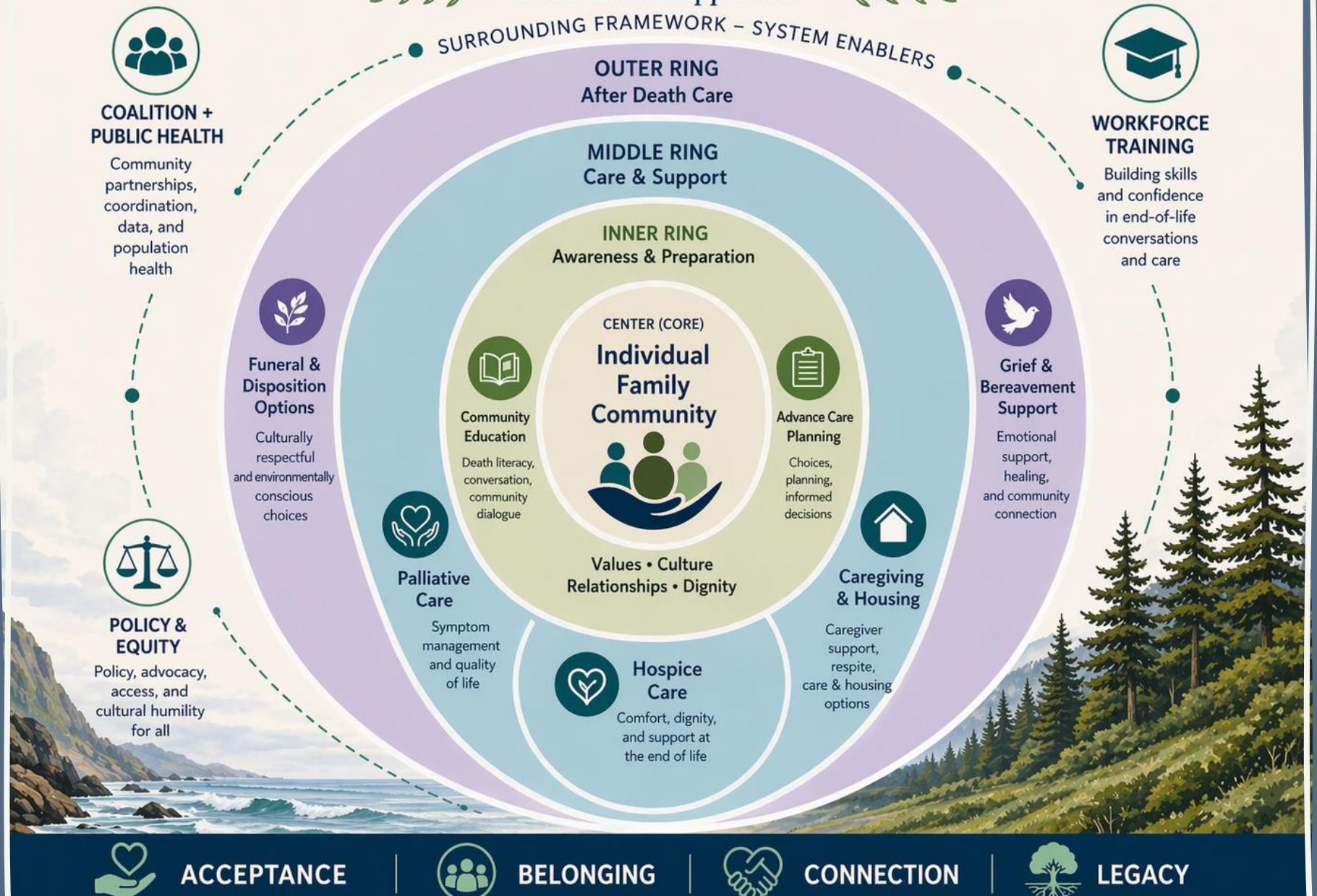
